

Early Years Pupil Premium Grant September 2022 to July 2023

The Early Years Pupil Premium (EYPP) is additional funding for early years settings to improve the education they provide for disadvantaged three and four year-olds.

Eligible children must be three or four years old and using their free early education entitlement and their parent or carer must receive one of the following benefits:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided they're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on, which is paid for 4 weeks after they stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit – your household income must be less than £7,400 a year after tax not including any benefits you get.

Funding may also be available if a child falls into one of the following groups:

- Looked after by the Local Authority
- Adopted from Care
- Has left Care through a Special Guardianship Arrangement
- Has left Care and is subject to a Child Arrangement Order (previously known as a residence order)

In 2022/2023 Greenfields has ten children eligible for EYPP funding and the grant to date is £3021

The EYPP funding in 2022/2023 is being used to provide resources for small group activities which will support children's speech and language development and has enabled staff to attend a range of speech and language training.

All children eligible for Early Years Pupil Premium are making steady progress and are working towards age expectation in all areas of learning.
